Dear Parents and Carers,

National Anti-Bullying Week – Monday 11th November to Friday 15th November 2024

The theme for Anti-Bullying Week 2024 is **'Choose Respect.'** Throughout the week your child will be participating in many activities linked to this theme. We will link the theme to our school value of **Respect.**

At Park Hill Infants we define bullying as 'the repetitive, intentional hurting of one person or group by another person or group' where the relationship involves an imbalance of power. It can happen face to face or online.' (Anti-Bullying Alliance)

The aim of the week is to help children and young people celebrate what makes them, and others, unique and that all beliefs and values should be respected. It will help them understand why it's important that every child feels included in school and feels safe to be themselves without fear of bullying. Throughout the week, the children will take part in circle time sessions and participate in role-playing scenarios, in order to think about how to treat others with kindness and respect.

On Tuesday 12th November, we will participate in 'Odd Socks Day 2024'. Please send your child into school wearing colourful odd socks, the purpose of which will be discussed in an assembly.

Through the 'Odd Socks' theme day, we are raising money for **Anti-Bullying Alliance** who:

- Help teachers and professionals working with children and young people to tackle bullying
- Offer advice for parents and carers on how to protect and support their children
- Influence and improve national policy on bullying
- Run the high-profile Anti-Bullying Week campaign in schools and communities across the country each November
