
A message from Ms Charman, Headteacher

Curriculum Enrichment – Spring One

We have had the following after school activities this half-term: Musical Theatre, Art Club, Multi-Sports, Football and Street Dance. Details of how to request places are circulated by email to parents/ carers prior to the end of each half-term for the next half-term.

Year Two have been learning about medieval art, architecture, and famous battles and invasions. Year Two were invited to dress up in costume as characters of their choice from the medieval ages for Medieval Day, where they took part in cross-curricular activities including archery, baking bread, weave-making, medallion-creating and enjoying their very own medieval banquet.


The whole school took part in Dress to Express Day for Children's Mental Health Week, and it was great to see the children expressing their own individuality and style.

For Number Day, each year group took part in a special workshop delivered by As Creatives called CSI: Storyland. Using a range of clues and their literacy and numeracy skills, children helped solve the mystery of the stolen Last (shoemaker's tool.) We loved seeing everyone's number-themed outfits.

As part of their learning for History, Year One took part in a workshop on the Titanic delivered by One Day Creative, where they learnt about the the timeline of the Titanic being built, the different people on board, and the sinking of the ship. They were encouraged to express their ideas and feelings through voice, movement, role play and drama.

The whole school took part in a special Lunar New Year assembly, and also completed class activities. Children learnt that Lunar New Year is celebrated by millions of people around the world, especially in east and south-east Asia, and the 15-day celebration begins with the new moon and lasts until the full moon.

Reception Curriculum Workshops













Our Reception Curriculum Workshops focussed on the topic Traditional Tales. Parents and carers were invited to come in and work alongside their children to build houses from different materials, such as straw and Lego bricks, inspired by the tale 'The Three Little Pigs'. They read stories together,

listened to stories on headphones on 'Now Press Play' and then talked about what happened in the stories.







Year Two Curriculum Workshops focussed on the events of the Great Fire of London. Parents and carers were invited to come in and work alongside their children to recreate the event on a small-scale to understand how the fire spread:

First, they constructed cardboard Tudor-themed houses and buildings and thatched the roofs with straw, discussing the potential issues behind these materials.

Then they set up a town of the houses in the playground and watched as the houses were set on fire! (The fire was extinguished safely by our trained staff.) From this activity, children learned that the Great Fire of London spread because houses were made of wood with thatched roofs and were built too close together. They also learned that windy conditions, on that day back in the past, transported burning embers to more buildings. Year Two then completed work in class linked to the workshop by creating fire safety posters.



New process for requesting a Leave of Absence during term time

If you have exceptional circumstances and wish to request a leave of absence during term time, please contact the school office on 0208 680 0747 or email <u>attendance@parkhill-inf.croydon.sch.uk</u> to request a meeting with a member of the Headship Team <u>as far in advance of the requested leave period as possible.</u>

After the meeting, if you still require term time absence from school you will be asked to complete a Leave of Absence request form and return it to the office prior to the start date of the requested leave period. We will continue to support you and your families in times of crisis and all requests for leave during term time will be considered on an individual basis. **If permission is not granted, but the leave is still taken, you may be referred to our EWO and/or the local authority for consideration of a Penalty Notice.**

New attendance framework:

Please be mindful if there are ten sessions of unauthorised absence recorded within a ten-week period a referral could be made to the local authority and a penalty notice may be issued to you. For a first referral the amount being £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days. There would be no reduction for a second referral within a three-year period.

Unauthorised absence includes <u>absence without justified cause, including medical evidence not been provided</u> when requested / no communication with school regarding absence / term time absence / late arrivals recorded after registration has closed.

<u>Uniform</u>

Children should wear the following items, each clearly named:

- grey pinafore dress, grey trousers or grey shorts
- light blue shirt
- school tie
- royal blue cardigan or V-necked jumper
- a light blue checked dress (for warmer weather)
- sensible school shoes.
- earrings are allowed, however, these must be studs not hoops. This is to avoid possible injury from getting them caught or pulled. (Earrings have to be removed before coming to school on swimming days—pool rules.)

PE Uniform

For physical education, all children should have the following items, each clearly named:

- a pair of navy blue shorts
- a light blue t-shirt
- Plimsolls
- a pair of jogging bottoms and a blue jumper (for colder weather)

None of our uniforms require a logo.

Buy new

You can buy suitable items from many high street stores such as Sainsburys, Asda, Lidl, Marks & Spencer, as well as Hewitts of Croydon.

Buy second hand

If you wish to enquire about any donated second-hand uniforms, suitable for sale at a reduced cost of £1 per item, please send an email to enquiries@parkhill-inf.croydon.sch.uk to let us know what items of uniform you are looking for and what size. We will then let you know if we have these items available and you will be able to make a payment on ParentPay. We will then have your items ready for collection at the school office.

Reminder about school meals

Our school meals are provided by The Greenshaw Learning Trust. School meals are free for all Infant aged children (Reception to Year 2). The menu is rotated every 2 weeks and the current menu can be downloaded from our school website. Hard copies are available at the school office.

The school meals meet the mandatory requirements of the School Food Standards 2015. The menus are nutritionally analysed to ensure they meet and in most cases exceed The School Food Standards with Halal Suitable and Vegan options available. **Therefore, these meals should <u>not be subsidised with food</u> <u>from home,</u> including condiments such as Tomato Sauce or Mayonnaise. You are welcome to provide your child with a packed lunch from home every day, or on days where the school dinner is not to their taste.**

Make sure that if your child received any new devices for Christmas, you set up parental controls on the devices. We regularly circulate online safety information by email and publish it on our website. To find out about setting

PCSO Ollie says...

I hope you all had enjoyable, fun festive and new year celebrations. As we have entered a new calendar year, please remember the following:

• If you park on the yellow zigzag lines between 8am-9.30am and 2pm-4pm, during term time, you are liable to pay a £65 Fixed Penalty Notice (fine);

- There is often a lot of traffic that can cause a bottleneck towards the junction at The Avenue, Stanhope Road—Whilst drivers are vigilant, they may not necessarily see a person dart out in front of them in time to stop. Therefore please take extra caution when crossing these roads and please do not run across any roads;
- Remember to hold hands of younger children when crossing any roads and obey the Green Cross Code;
- When you are dropping off or picking up, please do not stop your vehicle in the middle of the road. You could be liable to pay a £100 Fixed Penalty Notice and receive three points on your driving licence.


Bikes & Scooters



Breakfast/ After School Club


